THE GOSPEL OF PEACE

Sin causes one's soul to be agitated. There are numerous stresses, strains, anxieties and disturbances that are the by-products of a sinful life. A guilt-laden conscience may bring on emotional problems and contribute to physical stresses.

God has a (the) remedy. A person cannot run to the drug store and buy what He prescribes, taking it home in a bottle. It is not a pill. It is not distributed under the scrutiny of the Food and Drug Administration. People who are helping to dispense and apply it cannot be charged with practicing medicine without a license. God has given us all the license necessary for administering this cure.

God's tranquilizer for the soul of man is the gospel. When applied according to the directions, there is a quiet, a calm, a omposure, a release from tensions and anxiety that the Bible sums up under one word: "PEACE."

Jesus promised the disciples, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: Not as the world gives, give I unto you, Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid" (John 14:27). He closed His last discourse on the night of His betrayal with these words: "These thing I have spoken unto you, that in me you might have peace" (John 16:33).

The gospel justifies people on the basis of faith in Jesus Christ. That justification gives tranquility to the soul. "Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ..." (Rom. 5:1).

The Greek word for "peace" is defined as "the tranquil state of a soul assured of its salvation through Christ, and so fearing nothing from God and content with its earthly lot, of whatever sort that is."

Now we can better appreciate the fact that the wonderful news of redemption through Jesus is referred to as "the gospel of peace." "How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace..." (Rom. 10:15). The soldier of the Lord should have his feet shod "with the preparation of the gospel of peace" (Eph. 6:15).

Worry is both needless and sinful. God's word teaches us not to be anxious. "But in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus (Phil. 4:6, 7).
