## "OVERLOOKING THE OBVIOUS"

Why is it that more often than not the easiest and most obvious things are overlooked? It happens all the time. In spiritual matters just as well as it does in the physical. It is a constant source of amazement that so many "Bible scholars" miss something so openly obvious as the need for one to be baptized for the remission of sins. Years upon years are spent involved in study of the Scriptures. After which they are able to recite the genealogy of Jesus backward and forward. They may speak Greek, Latin and Hebrew. They can tell how many women are in the Bible, and in which book they are found.

In time these same "Bible scholars" will write book upon book about the Bible and social reform. Using the Bible as their theoretical backdrop, provided it suit their respective need of the moment, will champion any number of current cultural causes. They can regurgitate answers to a myriad of questions, but since they overlooked the obvious they can't answer at least one question truthfully: "What must we do to be saved?"


In the eyes of the Jewish leaders, Peter and John were viewed as "uneducated and untrained men" (Acts 4:13), but when Peter was asked the question of "what shall we do to be saved?", he had a ready answer. "Repent and let each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins..." (Acts 2:23).

The answer Peter gave on the day of Pentecost didn't change, even years later as noted in his first epistle, I Pet. 3:21, "And corresponding to that, baptism now saves you; not the removal of filth from the flesh, but an appeal to God for a good conscience through the resurrection of Jesus Christ." Paul as well provided the same answer as did Peter and both harmonize with the rest of the New Testament. It is really quite obvious (Gal. 3:27; Rom. 6:1-8).

Naaman in 2 Kings 5 was given specific instructions what to do in order to be cured of his leprosy. He willingly overlooked the obvious in hopes of something different than the prophets instructions. In doing so, he also remained with his leprosy. His servants came and reasoned with him, pointing out, "My father, had the prophet told you to do some great thing, would you not have done it? How much more then. when he says to you, 'Wash, and be clean'?" Upon compliance with God's simple instructions, he was cleansed.

Didn't you love open book tests when you were in school? The answers were right there, you just had to be careful not to overlook the obvious. The same is true with the Word of God.
