# "Trust in the Lord..."

"Trust in the Lord with all of your heart and do not lean on your own understanding." Proverbs 3:5 It is difficult at times to fully trust in God and His will. It was for the ancient heroes in the Bible as well. A man praised for his faith in Hebrews 11:8-19 is an example. Abraham (then Abram) received a promise from God that his descendants would be many (Genesis 12:1-7). Following this, Abram journeys into Egypt. We are told that Sarai, his wife, is a beautiful woman. Pharaoh takes notice of Sarai and desires her for himself. Abram tells Pharaoh that Sarai is his sister. This is a partial truth-Sarai is indeed Abram's halfsister ( Genesis 20:12). Abram does not tell Pharaoh this in the context of being informative. Abram's motive is selfpreservation (12:12) and compels Sarai to go along with the story. Pharaoh is angered when he discovers he was deceived and boots them out of Egypt.

God may have seen a need to reinforce His promise (15:1-6). The Scripture clearly states that Abram believes God (15:6). However, Abram and Sarai take things into their own hands again in chapter 16. Instead of letting the descendants come through their marriage, they decide that they need to fulfill God's plan by having Abram lay with Sarai's handmaiden Hagar. It seems the Lord recognizes further clarification is needed.

He reiterates the promise with more clarity in chapter 17, including a name change for Abram and Sarai. They are told that Sarah will have a son herself by Abraham and his name will be Isaac.

A situation similar to that of chapter 12 occurs in chapter 20. Abraham tells King Abimelech that Sarah is his sister, again the motive not to be informative, but clearly out of fear (20:11). Abimelech is upset about the deception, as Abraham nearly caused punishment from God to come upon Abimelech. Finally, in Genesis 21, the promise comes to fruition.

Abraham should have known that God would keep His promise. Why would Abraham fear his own death by Pharaoh and Abimelech? Obviously, the Lord would not permit a third party to kill Abraham before he had the promised descendant. Today in our walk with God, we can become impatient about answers to prayers, physical and spiritual growth, or even about the promise of Christ coming again to relieve us from the trials of this world. Perhaps we should remember Psalms 46:10: "Cease striving and know that I am God." The Hebrew for "cease" is to be still or relax. Relax and wait on God's will to come, don't allow Satan an opportunity to hurt you because impatience overpowered your faith.
