"How Much Do You Love"

True Love is Unselfish

Do you give away your last piece of gum, or M&M? Do you offer your Christmas fudge to everyone when you first open it or wait until after you are full and offer the left over pieces? Do you often consider vourself the one that has done the most on a project? Do you strive to be recognized as the most important in a group? Do you do things hoping folks will recognize you as the most loving servant they have ever seen? We must be constantly careful that we do not become selfish in our actions or motives.

New Commandment

Jesus was on His way to give His life on the cross, but He first washed the disciples feet (John 13). Later that night he said, "A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I havd loved you, that ye also love one another. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples if you have love one to another" (John 13:34-35). God had been commanding man to love each other for thousands of years, what is new about this command? The degree of love seems to be new. Jesus is teaching a love that fully considers others and offers total sacrifice of self.

Jesus Washed Feet

Jesus considered others needs and washed all their feet. This new commandment teaches unconditional love and service. Therefore, we serve each other in
