

# "You Will Mess Up: What You Need To Know"

You are loved by God (Ephesians 5:1; John 3:16) He showed his love when we deserved it the least (Romans 5:8).

There is nothing in this world or the heavens that can separate us from God's love (Romans 8:38-39).

The sacrifice of Jesus blood covers all the sins we confess before God (1 John 1:7-9). You can repent of any sin and God will remove it from you (Acts 3:19).
