

## **#14 - Stricken Beyond Healing (Jeremiah 14-15)**

### **I. Why Are You a Stranger? (14:1-12)**

- 14:1 to 15:4 is a conversation in the context of a \_\_\_\_\_ in Judah. (1)
- \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ are both put to shame, even the wild \_\_\_\_\_ can't take care of themselves—no rain, no grass, no vegetation. (2-6)
- The people say: (7-9)
- God says: (10-12)

### **II. Why Have You Stricken Us? (14:13-22)**

- Jeremiah points his finger at the \_\_\_\_\_ in Judah. (13)
- God says that's no \_\_\_\_\_: He did not \_\_\_\_\_ them, and they will die by the same disaster that they \_\_\_\_\_ will happen. (14-16)
