

## **#16 - The Sick, Deceitful Heart (Jeremiah 17)**

### **I. Tree Planted by the Water (17:1-11)**

- Judah's sin was \_\_\_\_\_ (permanently) on their \_\_\_\_\_ and altars and their idolatry was as close to them as their \_\_\_\_\_. (1-2)
